#### 4H and FFA Zebu Show

The Winn Parish Fair in Louisiana included zebu Oct. 1-6 in the combined livestock show for Jackson and Winn Parish. This was a local show that is a required show to qualify the 4H and FFA members to enter a district show in Rapids Parish and later an LSU State show in Gonzales, LA.

The young students trained their own calves, learned how to feed and care for them, grooming —including clipping and trimming, and washing. They also learned how to show their animal with and without a show stick.

Each animal was put in a halter class determined by the age and sex of the animal. Not only did all students show in at least one halter class, but was required to enter showmanship classes with all other students their ages.

The showmanship judge based his decisions on each students ability to show the animal and answer questions about the animal or the zebu breed. Examples: 1. What would you change about your zebu if you could? 2. Gestation period? 3. What do you feed it and how much?

About 30 minutes before the show began the County Agent gave a written test to all students. This test really let each student know about very important facts participants should know. Including body parts of cattle.

Roger Maxwell gave a workshop to parents and students the day before the show. (This was for all new comers to the breed.)

All the students are looking forward to the district and state shows coming up.
